PPSNTH-167 – Richmond Valley – DA 2022/0250 - 15 Petersons Quarry Rd, Coraki - Proposed extractive industry being an expansion of Petersons quarry

## **KEY ISSUES DISCUSSED**

- Site consists of a number of lots that is currently owned by two separate entities total site area of approximately 100.5ha
- Two existing consents/operations over the site, being Petersen's Quarry (320,000 t/pa and located on Council owned land) and Cooraki Quarry (State approved development extending over adjoining site)
- Proposed development outlined as gravel extraction:
  - o 350,000 t/pa (total of 4,900,000t)
  - o 34ha development footprint, including new excavation areas
  - o Vegetation removal
  - o Conventional drilling and blasting
  - o Continued operation of the existing processing plant
  - Processing and stockpiling of quarry products
  - Ancillary infrastructure site office, amenities and workshop
  - o Rehabilitation of the site for future industrial activities
  - Surrender of existing development consents for both operations
- Clarification sort from DPE in relation to surrendering of State development approval request for review of draft conditions in relation to rehabilitation requirements
- Final landform for future industrial use in the RU1 zone not supported by Council
- Draft rehabilitation plan to be reviewed prior to lodgement with Council and in consultation with DPE

- Exhibition completed with 2 submissions received requesting for life of quarry to be extended to reduce impacts
- External referrals:
  - o EPA GTAs issued (noting additional information required)
  - TfNSW Council identified as the local roads authority
- Internal referrals (traffic, noise and environmental health) are yet to be received
- Traffic
  - o no existing turning lanes where local road connects with regionally classified road
  - No maximum hourly or daily traffic movements provided only average with peaks –
    additional information required to determine noise and traffic requirements
- Noise assessment notes exceedance of levels, noting possibility of agreement with impact resident
- Vegetation removal submitted flora and fauna assessment notes no significant impact and not offset being required, but has not reviewed the existing consents in regard to vegetation outcomes
- Stormwater new detention basin proposed, with water balance details requested as part of the EPA GTAs and noting that potential for soil erosion requirements due to excavation into hillside
- Flood prone land lower area of the site impacted, including transport routes
- Progressive rehabilitation required as part of Cooraki consent but not undertaken, with conservation and rehabilitation bond lodged with the state government

#### Panel comments -

- Peer review recommended given Council interest
- Consultation with DPE required to address rehabilitation requirements, noting that progressive rehabilitation is not practical and alternative rehabilitation plan to be determined
- Future land use is to be determined as fundamental to the rehabilitation requirements
- Noise landholder agreement recommendation to be reviewed due to possible withdrawal of agreement or sale of the land. Alternative mitigation measures to be considered
- Quarry life to be specified to enable rehabilitation, with timeframe for rehabilitation completion to be also identified
- Traffic movements (hourly and daily) and haul route to be identified
- Consolidation of separate ownership lots to be sort as single operation proposed and one EPL
- Costed rehabilitation plan to be provided and should include a bond
- The Panel noted Council's recommendation in the briefing report but disregarded this comment and will consider the application on its merits

**TENTATIVE DETERMINATION DATE SCHEDULED FOR:** Late March
