## **KEY ISSUES DISCUSSED**

- Proposal identified as alterations and additions to the Alstonville Entertainment Centre, as the existing facility requires a significant upgrade and additional area around courts
- Key issues identified as
  - o Traffic and car parking consideration for disabled accessible parking spaces to be located at ground level and provision of pedestrian pathways to cater for patrons accessing the site.
  - Privacy for residential properties located to the north, with proposed DCP building envelope variation on northern elevation
  - Signage detailed information required
  - Sewer main confirmation of existing sewer main being decommissioned is required
  - Noise impact assessment required, outlining the acoustic treatments proposed and additional courtyard areas
  - Waste management to be identified
- Exhibition completed with 3 submissions received (in favour)
- Minor height variation proposed (0.45m), noting existing sports hall exceedance
- Internal Referrals -
  - Engineering & Public Health additional information requested
  - o Building, Trade waste, Food, Plumbing and Drainage outstanding
- External referral to NSW Police pedestrian safety and need for crossing raised as a concern

## Panel Comments -

- Peer review recommended given Council interest
- Pedestrian safety and benefits of pedestrian crossing noted, which would require Local Traffic Committee approval
- Parking for visiting teams to be identified
- Noise impacts additional information required to adequate identify potential impacts
- Potential for greater capacity and increased use as a result of the works potential adverse impacts on neighbours and additional car parking to be considered
- Hours of operation to be identified
