Hi Julie,

There are no plans to divert the 380 as requested by Rob as part of 16 Cities – Grafton. The 16C program is a short-term program that can respond to immediate unmet demand (and other existing issues), eg a well-established estate not currently served by buses; but not to-be-delivered developments and infrastructure.

Also, this diversion would preclude the proposed continued routing of 380 via Shores Dr, Gumnut Dr, Treelands Dr to serve that residential area and Yamba Fair.

We can assess the need to bus services to a new estate once developed and subject to funding becoming available for further improvements post 16C.

In the meantime I'd suggest that road and intersection width along Oolong Lane, Miles Street and Carrs drive be preserved for bus-length-and-width vehicles, and the developer is welcome to incorporate suitable bus-zones / pullover bays into key locations not less than 400-500m apart, eg close to a main residential pocket, or in proximity to the retirement village.
