MATTER DETERMINED

PPSNTH-260 – Clarence Valley – DA2023/0580 – 9720 Armidale Road, Tyringham – Extractive industry (Proposed continuation of use and expansion of existing quarry) (as described in Schedule 1).

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

Development application

The Panel determined to approve the development application pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Panel determined to approve the application for the following reasons:

- The proposed development is a continuation of an existing approved quarry operation. It is
 permissible within the RU1 Primary Production zone and is consistent with relevant zone objectives. It
 satisfies the relevant provisions of the Clarence Valley LEP and other applicable State Planning Policies
- 2. The site is suitable for the continued use and, together with the proposed conditions of consent, will ensure that noise, traffic, environmental and operational impacts can be adequately mitigated.
- 3. The Panel has imposed a condition to limit the life of the pit to 20 years or 1.8m tonnes. This will ensure that rehabilitation of the site is adequately planned and implemented.
- 4. The Panel is satisfied the proposal will provide quarry products for the region, provide local employment and have direct and broader socio-economic impacts.
- 5. For the reasons given above, the proposal is in the public interest. The Panel notes there were no public submissions made during the exhibition.

CONDITIONS

The Development Application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report with the following amendments.

• Amend Condition 1 to remove 'Appendix B Existing Approved Quarry, Council report on Ellis' Pit, prepared by Nymboida Shire Council, date of document 21.2.1996 and 20.5.2008'

- Amend Condition 4 Maximum annual extraction, to delete the following: **Extraction** means the removal of overburden, the extraction, processing, handling of extracted material in relation to this consent.
- Insert new Condition 6, which reads as follows and renumber the remaining conditions accordingly:
 - 6. Rehabilitation, period of extraction and extraction limit Extractive activities approved under this consent are to cease and rehabilitation of the extractive area is to occur 20 years from the date of consent or from when 1.8 million tonnes of extraction of material has been reached, whichever occurs first. Complete rehabilitation of the site must be undertaken in accordance with an approved Rehabilitation Management Plan (as set out in Condition 26).

Condition reason: To ensure that rehabilitation will occur within a reasonable time

- Amend the reasoning of former Condition 7 (now Condition 8) Costs of alterations and extensions, to read as follows:
 Condition reason: To ensure any damage to public or private infrastructure is rectified.
- Amend former Condition 8 (now Condition 9) Works in Road Reserve, by deleting the first sentence.
- Amend former Condition 9 (now Condition 10) Surrender of Consent, by inserting the words 'quarry operations under' after the words 'the commencement of'.
- Amend former Condition 16 (now Condition 17) Quarry access road to update the condition reference to Condition 9
- Amend former Condition 17 (now Condition 18), part e, to read as follows:
 e. Methods for protection of assets (including fuel storage) within the quarry footprint;
- Amend former Condition 21 (now Condition 22) Fauna spotter for clearing, by inserting 'to' after the words 'fauna spotter' in the first sentence
- Amend former Condition 23b) (now Condition 24b)) Annual Plan of Management, by amending the last dot point, inserting another dot point and amending the condition reason, to read as follows:
 - a staged rehabilitation plan for the life of the quarry showing rehabilitated areas and proposed rehabilitation in the next twelve (12) months
 - an updated Fire Management Plan as outlined in Condition 18

Condition reason: To provide an update of annual operations in accordance with the Plan of Management

- Amend former Condition 28 (now Condition 29) Aboriginal relics, by deleting the words' Director-General of the NSW Department of Environment and Conservation' and replacing with 'Secretary of the NSW Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water'
- Amend former Condition 30 (now Condition 31) Clearing of vegetation, by replacing 'EIS' with "Environmental Impact Statement'

CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

In coming to its decision, the Panel notes that no written submissions were made during public exhibition and therefore no issues of concern were raised.
