PPSNTH-90 – Byron – 10.2021.234.1 at 23 Bayshore Drive, Byron Bay – TAFE NSW Connected Learning Centre (as described in Schedule 1)

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

Development application

The panel determined to approve the development application pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The panel determined to approve the application for the following reasons:

- 1. The proposal is permissible in the B7 zone and is consistent with relevant zone objectives.
- 2. The development site is suitable for the intended use as it has good access, all other necessary services and is compatible with neighbouring uses.
- 3. The proposal's amended design and the conditions imposed mean that the proposal will be satisfactory from an environmental perspective.
- 4. The proposal will provide valuable education facilities and therefore be beneficial from a social perspective.
- 5. For the reasons given above approval of the application is in the public interest.

CONDITIONS

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the council assessment report with the following amendment:

• In Schedule 4, the section under the sub-heading 'Section 170 Heritage and Conservation Register and State Heritage Inventory' to be deleted, up to and not including the sub-heading 'Principal Certifying Authority'.

CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

In coming to its decision, the panel notes that no written submissions were made during public exhibition and therefore no issues of concern were raised.
