### **KEY ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

The application relies on existing development consent 1184/2018/ZE to create the development lot and roads for vehicular access to the proposed development. Consent 1184/2018/ZE will require modification in order to:

- Reconfigure stormwater arrangements for the site as a temporary stormwater detention basin is approved in the location of the childcare centre.
- Replace approved housing lots 1-5 with a consolidated vacant development lot
- Development contributions.

The Panel notes that these modifications are intrinsic to the operation of Consent 1184/2018/ZE and cannot be dealt with as ancillary matters associated with the current application. They will require a separate modification application to be submitted which demonstrates their satisfactory resolution prior to the determination of the current application.

The proposal seeks kerbside waste collection which Council does not support and therefore the basement will likely require redesign to accommodate a waste collection vehicle for on-site collection (MRV or SRV).

Various other planning, waste, engineering, environmental health, landscaping matters were raised with the applicant in Council correspondence on 16 August and 17 September 2020. These included parking grades and circulation, site levels and earthworks, fencing, acoustics, salinity, and compliance with the Child Care Planning Guideline.
