# MATTER DETERMINED

PPSSCC-220 - SPP-21-00001 - Blacktown City Council, 54 Westminster Street, Schofields, demolition of existing structures and the construction and operation of a single storey centre-based childcare facility (accommodating 106 children and 17 staff members) with 29 basement and 7 at-grade car parking spaces, and associated retaining walls and landscaping works (as described in Schedule 1).

# PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION
