# PPSSCC-328- 1040/2022/JP - The Hills Shire - 3-5 Rosario Place

Construction of Transport Depot - The Development Application is for the construction of a transport depot and associated workshop and office building. The proposal is essentially a rearrangement of a previously approved transport depot on the subject site (DA 992/2019/HC) to facilitate the decommissioning of the diesel-powered bus fleet to electric buses.

## **KEY ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Twelve submissions were received during the notification period and issues raised included:
  - o Concerns that there could be another depot entrance off Mile End Road.
  - o Noise and light spill from bus movements.
  - Proposed bus depot is not a light industrial use and should not be allowed in Light Industrial Zone.
  - o Road, traffic and pedestrian issues.
- Need for applicant to ensure that information to address these issues has been submitted with this
  application and not just to rely on information submitted with previous application.
- Confirmation was given that there is no access proposed to Mile End Road.
- Roundabout at Withers Road that was a previous requirement is still understood to be required.
- The depot will progressively ramp up the percentage of electric buses from commencement and in line with government initiatives over the next 8 10 years.

The Panel supports progress to a determination as soon as possible, noting the above.
