ISSUES LIST

Chair reviewed attendance and introduced Kick Off Briefing purpose and process.

Applicant

- Provided description of proposed development, existing development within the locality and planning context
- Advised basement parking is generally compliant (however not completely) with NCC. Double checking travel distances to see if improvement can be achieved however alternate solutions available
- Outlined design of play areas with aim for separation from neighbouring residential areas and provision of shade
- Described tiering of building to limit imposition on existing neighbouring dwellings

Council

- Application assessment is nearing completion for reporting to panel, awaiting final internal referral (engineering)
- One RFI request outstanding with respect to bulky waste storage areas
- Advised Council generally satisfied with the provision of play spaces with respect to area and orientation, final assessment of privacy interaction with adjoining approved developments to be completed
- Exhibition period concluded, no submissions received

Chair

- Sought detail from Council on whether the application is acceptable with respect to Council's play space requirements
- Noted the importance of provision of shaded outdoor play areas.

Council is yet to undertake its full application assessment, so this record is not a final list of the issues they will need to consider in order to draft their recommendation.
