

Suggested Planting Palette

The project site includes the heritage Ficus macrophylla located adjacent to Perth House. This significant tree is understood to have been planted sometime between 1844 to 1846. Any new tree plantings should consider this significant tree and not encroach or compete with the canopy of the existing tree nor detract from its presence around Perth House or along George Street.

There is an existing established Platanus orientalis 'Digitata' street tree located within the front verge of the site that is required to be retained. Given the size and positioning of this tree along the George Street frontage, no additional street tree plantings along the verge are suggested.

The surrounding landscapes of Parramatta include the Cumberland Plains, a critically endangered ecological community that includes a mix of grassy woodlands and open plains. Species within the Cumberland Plains include a mixture of groundcovers, grasses, small shrubs and woodland tree species important to the Burramattagal people.

The development of a species mix for 81-83 George Street & 1 Barrack Lane should consider this important ecological community. The species mix should not aim to replicate the exact conditions or environs of the Cumberland Plains, rather it should, where possible, incorporate and showcase some of these important species.

A species mix should also be informed by First Nations consultancy and engagement with Traditional Owners and community members as part of the design development of the project site.
