Public meeting held by videoconference on 20 June 2024, opened at 11:00am and closed at 4:19pm.

Papers circulated electronically on 8 August 2024.

Panel met on 22 August 2024 to consider the deferred application and amended plans and reports. Meeting opened 12.30pm and closed 1.30pm.

MATTER DETERMINED

PPSSCC-452 – The Hills – 1747/2023/JP – 77 Castle Street, Castle Hill - Construction of a Carpark and Associated Landscape Works.

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings and the matters listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

Development application

The panel determined to approve the development application pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The panel determined to approve the application for the reasons outlined in the council assessment report.

The Panel in approving the application notes the fundamental importance of the provision of additional landscaping and planting in the 7 metre setback to the adjoining residential properties on reducing the visual impact of the parking structure.

The ongoing maintenance and replanting of the green walls and landscape area is important to be regulated and monitored as part of the conditions of consent to ensure the landscape area and the visual buffer is maintained, particularly given the southerly aspect. Appropriate species suited to this aspect are to be used.

CONDITIONS

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the addendum council assessment report uploaded to the Planning Portal on 7 August 2024.

CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

In coming to its decision, the panel considered written submissions made during public exhibition and heard from all those wishing to address the panel. The panel notes that issues of concern included:

- Traffic hazard and safety issues.
- Additional noise and pollution from construction and operation of the multi-storey parking complex.
- Overshadowing and loss of privacy.
- Car parking.
- Inadequate infrastructure support.
- Building design, acoustic impacts, 24 hour lighting

The panel considers that concerns raised by the community have been adequately addressed in the assessment report and that no new issues requiring assessment were raised during the public meeting.
