MATTER DETERMINED

PPSSCC-484 - Blacktown - DA-22-01379 - 65 Owen Street Glendenning - Demolition of structures, removal of trees and construction of an access bridge over Council's existing drainage reserve to the existing bus depot at 150 Glendenning Road and the construction of a new bus depot, a 5 storey car park, a workshop building, a 3 storey administration building, fuel storage and dispensing bays and a bus wash bay.

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at briefings and the matters listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

Development application

The panel determined to refuse the development application pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The panel determined to refuse the application for reasons, generally as outlined in the council assessment report, as follows:

- The proposal will result in a negative impact on the surrounding built environment as the applicant has not demonstrated that on-site car parking can be provided for all the users on the site resulting in demand for on-street parking which will impact on the surrounding industrial road network which is already congested [Section 4.15(b) of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979].
- The site is not suitable for the development as there is inadequate engineering, drainage and parking information provided to enable a complete assessment of the development's likely impacts on the drainage channel, adjoining land and the locality. The applicant has not satisfied Council that the site can cater for this development [Section 4.15(b) Section 4.15(c) of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979].
- The proposal is not in the public interest as insufficient information has been provided to enable a complete assessment, and as such the proposal in its present form will have a serious impact on the amenity of the area [Section 4.15(e) of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979].

CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

In coming to its decision, the panel notes that no written submissions were made during public exhibition and therefore no issues of concern were raised.
