Public meeting held by teleconference on 29 June 2023, opened at 2.30pm and closed at 3.30pm.

MATTER DEFERRED

PPSSEC-196 - DA/199/2022 – Randwick - 509-511 Bunnerong Road, Matraville, St Agnes educational establishment, child-care centre development, Alterations to existing educational establishment, child-care centre and ancillary signage (as described in Schedule 1).

REASONS FOR DEFERRAL

The Panel considered the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel determined to defer the development application pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The panel was not able to determine this matter, given the conflicting information from both Council and applicant in respect of the traffic impact of the development. With the traffic impacts unresolved, the Panel decided to defer further consideration of the application until the following additional information is provided:

- Supplementary Traffic Impact Assessment that:
 - identifies the total number of current students and the additional number of students proposed by the development;
 - includes a traffic impact assessment of the total development (being the total number of students as proposed by the development), with particular regard the use of the kiss and drop area in Norfolk Lane; and
 - o includes a Green Travel Plan.

The panel resolved that the Supplementary Traffic Impact Assessment is to be undertaken by a person appointed by agreement between the Council and Applicant and at the cost of the Applicant.

The Panel agreed to undertake a briefing to consider the final Supplementary Traffic Impact Assessment on the 7th September 2023, from the person engaged to undertaken the Supplementary Traffic Impact Assessment, Council and Applicant to the panel.

The Panel resolved that the issues of concern to Council expressed in its assessment report, other than traffic and parking issues, can all be resolved by appropriate drafting of conditions.

The Panel requests Council to provide a Supplementary Assessment Report by 21st September 2023, that includes an assessment of the Supplementary Traffic Impact Assessment and the resolution of the

remaining issues of concern expressed in the Council assessment report. The Panel will then reconvene on the 5th October 2023 to further consider the proposal. The Panel will determine the matter electronically.

The decision to defer the matter was unanimous. The Panel adjourned during the meeting to deliberate on the matter and formulate a resolution.
