MATTER DETERMINED

PPSSEC-239 - Waverley - DA-455/2022 – Bronte Marine Drive, Bronte - Demolition of Bronte Surf Club building and associated structures, and the construction of a new Bronte Surf Life Saving Club and associated community facility upgrades, including upgrades to seawall and pathway access (as described in Schedule 1).

REASONS FOR DEFERRAL

The Panel considered the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at the meetings and observed at the site inspection listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

The Panel agreed to defer the determination of the matter until April. The matter was deferred to allow for the provision and assessment of further information as required by the Coastal Management Act, 2016 (Section 27) and the State Environmental Planning Policy (Resilience and Hazards) 2021 (particularly, Clause 2.9 and 2.12) of as insufficient information has been provided to make an informed determination.

In particular, an analysis and reporting of the impacts of the proposed structure on the beach and details as to how those impacts will be managed and mitigated over the life of the development, are required.

The decision to defer the matter was unanimous.

ACTIONS

To allow for the progression of the Development Application to determination, the Panel directed that:

- 1. The Applicant shall provide the analysis and report of the impacts of the proposed structure on the beach and upload all documentation to the Planning Portal by 28 February 2024.
- 2. Council is requested to provide an addendum assessment report responding to the matters above, which is to be uploaded to the Planning Portal by within 3 weeks of the upload of the Applicants required information to the Planning Portal.
- 3. When the updated assessment report is received the Panel will undertake a final briefing on 02 April 2024 **and/or** determine the application by way of electronic determination.

If the outstanding information is not provided by 12 March 2024 the Panel may move to determine the DA based on the information currently at hand.
