MATTER DETERMINED

PPSSEC-299 – Inner West– MOD/2023/0326 – 43 Roberts Street, 50, 52, Edith Street & 67, 73 Mary Street, St Peters – Section 4.56 application to modify Land and Environment Court Determination DA/2021/0800 to delete the tanking of the basement and amend the design to enable a drained basement, and changes to conditions, including to amend the staging and timing of delivery of art studio, substation, and public domain works (as described in Schedule 1).

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel is satisfied that the modification application results in substantially the same development as approved by the Land and Environmental Court.

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

Application for modification of consent

The Panel determined to approve the modification application pursuant to section 4.56 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Panel determined to approve the application for the reasons outlined in the Council Assessment Report.

CONDITIONS

The Development Application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report (amended on 26 June 2024).

CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

In coming to its decision, the Panel considered written submissions made during public exhibition and heard from all those wishing to address the Panel. The Panel notes that issues of concern included:

- Ground and stormwater water treatment and discharge
- Noise emanating from the development
- Vehicular and pedestrian traffic management during construction
- Management and staging of project

The Panel considers that concerns raised by the community have been adequately addressed in the Assessment Report. The Panel notes that in addressing these issues appropriate conditions have been imposed.
