Demolition and construction of a new indoor recreation facility.

Demolition of buildings and structures at Heffron Park and construction of a two storey 'recreation facility (indoor)' with 'café', including ancillary administration uses, car parking areas, vehicular access to Bunnerong Road, signage, floodlighting, site remediation, tree removal, public domain works, landscaping and associated works in accordance with a concept development application.

- Overview of application
- Traffic and parking generation
- Light spillage to any residential properties from the lighting to the Showcase Field;
- Possible site contamination and remediation works required for the site;
- The appropriateness of the design and scale of the proposed Heffron Centre in regard to the site context, particularly the residential and park interface;
- Sustainable design of the new facility
- Consistency of the proposal with the Heffron Park Plan of Management 2009 and the Heffron Park Draft Landscape Masterplan 2017

SUBMISSIONS

- To date, five (5) submissions have been received in response to the application, including one letter of support; unique issues raised include:
 - o design of the new indoor recreational facility
