#### **MATTER DETERMINED**

PPSSNH-387 – KU-RING-GAI – MOD0020/23, 25 Bushlands Avenue, Gordon, Modification to Land and Environment Court Approval 14219 of 2018 (DA0418/15) for a residential aged care facility proposing additional tree removal (as described in Schedule 1).

#### PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7, the material presented at meetings and briefings, and the matters listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

### **Development application**

The Panel determined to approve the modification application pursuant to section 4.56 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The Panel's decision was unanimous.

#### **REASONS FOR DECISION**

This application is a s. 4.56 modification application to a development consent for works that had a capital investment value of more than \$30 million. The original development application (DA0418/15) was approved by the Land and Environment Court on 7 May 2019.

The modifications are for the removal of four dead or dying trees from the subject site. No physical changes to the approved built form of the development are required.

The modifications triggered entry into the Biodiversity Offset Scheme (BOS) as it is proposed to remove Tree 124 *Eucalyptus pilularis* (Blackbutt), which is located within the NSW biodiversity land values map. The Applicant submitted a biodiversity development assessment report (BDAR) prepared by an accredited assessor who applied the Biodiversity Assessment Method (the BAM) to assess the impacts of the proposed modifications. Council accepts the BDAR on ecological grounds, subject to recommended Condition 1E.

In summary, the Panel is satisfied that the modification proposal has been properly assessed against relevant planning controls, is substantially the same as the development originally approved, and will increase the supply of high quality seniors housing in the local area.

The Panel considers that the development as modified will not result in adverse impacts when compared to the approved development and it is in the community interest.

## **CONDITIONS**

The Panel approves the modification application subject to the recommended amended and additional conditions in Council's Assessment Report. In summary, these require that suitable replacement trees be provided.

Changes to the conditions of the consent to DA0418/15 are;

- Conditions 42C and 67 are to be amended; and
- New Conditions 1D, 1E, 19E and 42E are to be added.

The Council's Assessment Report refers to a proposed amendment of Condition 1C; however, this is not necessary with the addition of new Condition 1D.

## **CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS**

In coming to its decision, the Panel considered 2 written submissions made during the public exhibition of the proposal. Issues raised included Tree removal and Development is out of character for the area.

The Panel considers concerns raised in submissions have been adequately addressed in Council's Assessment Report.
