### **KEY MATTERS DISCUSSED**

The Panel notes the applicant's presentation and matters discussed with the applicant and council during the briefing. In particular, the Panel notes:

- Heritage issues query.
- Council queried landscaping, documentation (additional information required such as detail of operations and fit out plans) and matters raised during the design excellence panel meeting.
- The proposed use of the ground floor retail has not been specified so the Panel suggested that (if approved) council consider including a waiver in the application/conditions, to clarify that the use of the space is not part of this determination.

- RFI to be issued in the next 7 days with a response likely by the end of June.
- Determination estimated for late July/early August.
