MATTER DETERMINED

PPSSTH-115 – Queanbeyan Palerang Regional Council – DA.2020.1351 at 360A Lanyon Drive TRALEE NSW 2620 – Construct Recreation Facilities (as described in Schedule 1).

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

Development application

The Panel determined to approve the development application subject to conditions pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Panel determined to approve the application for the reasons outlined in the Council's updated assessment report noting the report adequately addressed several issues previously raised by the Panel including:

- The Panels concerns regarding contamination and previous remediation;
- The interrelationship between activities approved under Part 5 of the Act and the development approved by the Panel. This included additional information in an amended SEE on the extent of both approvals including parking arrangements;
- Confirmation that all biodiversity and conservation matters had been adequately addressed;
- An assessment against relevant DCP provisions;
- A requirement that the stormwater management plan accompanying the DA be incorporated into the instrument of consent as a condition; and
- Several administrative matters relating to the conditions.

The Panel notes that in making its final recommendations, Council provided additional documentation:

- An amended SEE which included advice on REF and DA works
- Greater detail on contamination and remediation;
- More detailed plans on the proposal to rebuild the Heritage item; and
- An updated bushfire assessment.

CONDITIONS

The Development Application was approved subject to the recommended conditions in Council's updated assessment report.

CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

In coming to its decision, the Panel notes that there was only 1 submission received (objection) during exhibition raising various coordination issues with infrastructure commitments on adjoining land.. The Panel is satisfied that these issues have been adequately addressed. Furthermore, the Panel also notes that the submission was formally withdrawn.
