Development Application s4.14 – Other – Electricity Generating Works BESS - 3 TURTON PLACE MURRUMBATEMAN 2582, 23//DP248413

I refer to your correspondence dated 23/08/2024 seeking advice regarding bush fire protection for the above Development Application in accordance with section 4.14 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act* 1979.

The New South Wales Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) has considered the information submitted and provides the following recommended conditions:

General Conditions

1. The recommendations are based on the documents/plans supplied via Councils referral to the NSW RFS.

- The plans prepared by ACENERGY project number 23118 dated 30/4/2024.
- The bush fire management and emergency response plan prepared by Harris Environmental Consulting REF 6559BF dated 16/5/2024.

Council is advised that where a minor amendment to the above-noted documents is proposed, Council may use its discretion to determine whether the minor amendment warrants further assessment by the NSW RFS.

2. All Bushfire Management and Protection Measures identified in Chapter 6 of the bush fire management and emergency response plan prepared by Harris Environmental Consulting REF 6559BF dated 16/5/2024 shall be maintained during construction, operation and decommissioning of the development **except that a 12 metre wide APZ shall be maintained to the west of the BESS**.

3. The following amendments shall be made to the "Bushfire and Emergency Evacuation Plan" at page 31 of the report prepared by Harris Environmental Consulting REF 6559BF dated 16/5/2024:

- For Murrumbateman Brigade remove the mobile phone number referenced and replace with "02 6226 3100" and "000".
- For Springfield Brigade remove the mobile phone number referenced and replace with "02 6226 3100" and "000".

Dear Sir/Madam,

We refer to Council's correspondence via the NSW ePlanning portal seeking comment from Essential Energy in relation to the proposed development at the above property.

Strictly based on the documents submitted, Essential Energy has no comments to make as to potential safety risks arising from the proposed development.

Essential Energy makes the following general comments:

- 1. If the proposed development changes, there may be potential safety risks and it is recommended that Essential Energy is consulted for further comment.
- 2. Any existing encumbrances in favour of Essential Energy (or its predecessors) noted on the title of the above property should be complied with.
- 3. In addition, Essential Energy's records indicate there is electricity infrastructure located within close proximity of the property. Any activities within this location must be undertaken in accordance with the latest industry guideline currently known as <u>ISSC 20 Guideline for the Management of Activities within Electricity Easements and Close to Infrastructure</u>. Approval may be required from Essential Energy should activities within the property encroach on the electricity infrastructure.
- 4. Prior to carrying out any works, a "Dial Before You Dig" enquiry should be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of *Part 5E (Protection of Underground Electricity Power Lines)* of the *Electricity Supply Act 1995* (NSW).
- 5. Given there is electricity infrastructure in the area, it is the responsibility of the person/s completing any works around powerlines to understand their safety responsibilities. SafeWork NSW (<u>www.safework.nsw.gov.au</u>) has publications that provide guidance when working close to electricity infrastructure. These include the Code of Practice Work near Overhead Power Lines and Code of Practice Work near Underground Assets.
