**Increase in Volume of Waste Processed at Mainstream Resources Resource
Recovery Facility, 6 Sleight Place Wetherill Park NSW 2164
DA 350.1/2023

We write in reference to Fairfield City Council RFI dated 22 March 2024, including NSW Environment Protection Authority RFI 21 December 2023.

Withdrawal of Street Sweeping Waste Component

Following discussions and review, the proponent Mainstream Recycling seeks to withdraw the 4,000 tonnes per annum of street sweeping waste from our proposal.

Mainstream Recycling secured a modification approval to include street sweeping waste within its 29,500tpa processing limit (MA 803.6/2014). An amendment to receive street sweeping waste from NSW Environment Protection Authority for the Facility Environment Protection Licence (EPL#20694) was made and subsequently withdrawn in 2023. No street sweeping waste has been, or is proposed to be, accepted at the Facility. Mainstream Recycling seeks to allow MA 803.6/2014 to lapse.

Further, Mainstream Recycling sought to continue its consent to accept up to 4,000 tpa of street sweeping waste within its application to increase processing capacity to 65,000 tpa in 2023 (DA350.1/2023). Mainstream Recycling wishes to withdraw the street sweeping component from this application, which would now comprise:

- Stormwater/GPT material: 64,000 tpa
- Wood waste (sawdust): 1,000 tpa

There would be no changes to the Facility and operations and predicted impacts resulting from the above eg traffic, truck movement, truck sizes, air quality, land use, amenity, noise, operating would be unaffected. The above change is considered to be immaterial. We do not consider that this change in any way affects the assessment, application, notification/exhibition or agency consultation process to date.

Extension of Time Request

Council's RFI, dated 22 March 2024, advises that a response is required within fourteen days. Mainstream Recycling commenced review and information gathering upon receipt of the RFU. However we note that several requested items require significant resources, including external specialists. We request that Council 'stop the clock' while this response is prepared, and commit that Mainstream Resources is acting in good faith and taking all reasonable steps to provide an accurate and timely response.
