KEY ISSUES DISCUSSED

- The initial matter to be resolved is whether the development is regional development. Advice from Council's legal officer on that subject is required.
- A second important matter is the status of the planning proposal which would prohibit the use of cemetery on the land, particularly as to whether the draft instrument is likely to be exhibited prior to determination of this DA.
- A third issue is the progress of the pending Class 1 merit appeal against the refusal of the more
 intensive proposal by the panel applying the decision and reasons of the IPC. The panel understands
 that this proposal is submitted entirely independently of the DA the subject of the appeal, but it may
 be that the conciliation processes of the Court allow a good means by which an acceptable
 compromise can be explored.
- Issues of permissibility will arise in relation to the proposal to alter, extend or change the existing use of the club house.

- The separation of the cemetery use from the township visually and in terms of the long term future development of Wallacia is an important consideration
- The Biodiversity Conservation Act will apply noting that a BDAR has been submitted. The impact on ecology generally on the site must be carefully considered.
- There are important ground water issues which will need to be explored.
- The social impact of the proposed expansion of the gaming use will need to be considered noting the potential for impacts on Wallacia as an isolated township.
- Overall the revised proposal does include a number of substantial amendments which pick up recommendations from the IPC reasoning.
