MATTER DETERMINED

PPSWES -170 - DA 47/2022 – Murrumbidgee, Lots 68 & 69 DP 750877, 16705 Sturt Highway, Darlington Point, Electricity generating development (private infrastructure) involving the installation of 11,016 solar panels with a electricity generation capacity of 11,000mWh per year with battery storage (as described in Schedule 1).

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

Development application

The Panel determined to approve the development application pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*, as per Council's recommended conditions as amended by the Panel.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The proposed development involves the construction and operation of a micro solar farm with a maximum export capacity to the grid of 5 MW. Development involves the installation of 11,016 ground mounted photovoltaic (PV) solar modules on single axis trackers, with a capacity of 4.95 Megawatts (MW) AC, and the installation of a two battery energy storage system with a combined capacity of up to 4.586 MWh and associated components. Ancillary features include electrical collection systems (e.g., a switch room, control room and inverter station), and high voltage electrical switchgear to connect the existing privately owned HV electricity network. Details of new permanent perimeter fencing and temporary structures, amenities, and equipment storage areas for use during the construction phase have been included with this development application. The proposed electricity generating facility will have a footprint of approximately 7ha.

The Panel agrees with the Council's assessment that the proposed development satisfies the provisions of the relevant environmental planning instruments and is permissible within the RU1 Primary Production zone of Murrumbidgee Local Environmental Plan 2013 by virtue of the provisions of clause 2.36(1)(a) of State Environmental Planning Policy (Transport and Infrastructure) 2021.

The Panel concurs with the Council's assessment that potential impacts of the development have been minimised through design and the proposed conditions of consent as amended. In summary, the Panel concurs with Council that the proposal has been properly assessed against all relevant planning controls,

the site is suitable for the proposed development, and the proposed development does not raise any matter contrary to the public interest.

The application was referred to Transport for NSW and Essential Energy and the Panel has accepted the recommended conditions (as amended) to address the requirements of these agencies.

CONDITIONS

During the final briefing with the applicant and the Council, the Panel considered the applicant's concerns regarding the construction of various conditions, and the Council's comments in reply. Further to an exchange of views by email between the Council and the applicant concerning conditions 8(I) and 17(f) the Panel approved the development application subject to the conditions as recommended in the Council assessment report with the following amendments to Condition 8(I) and Condition 17(f):

Condition 8(I)

Prior to the commencement of works on the site, the developer must design and construct the works within the road reserve of the Sturt Highway to the satisfaction of Transport for NSW (TfNSW).

Condition 17(f)

Waste will not be accepted at any waste management facility operated by Murrumbidgee Council.

Condition 8(I) was amended by the Panel having regard to matters of road safety, and condition 17(f) was amended to accord with the preference of the applicant.

CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

The development application was notified in accordance with the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation, 2021 and Murrumbidgee Council's Community Participation Plan. Three submissions were received. Matters raised in the submissions from TfNSW and Essential Energy have been satisfactorily addressed by the recommended conditions. One submission was received from Coleambally Irrigation Co-Operative Limited. This submission was for information purposes only and did not raise any matter in objection to the proposed development.
