MATTER DETERMINED

PPSWES-269 – Mid-Western – DA0070/2025 at 1848 Castlereagh Highway, Tallawang – Extractive Industry (Hard Rock Quarry) as described in Schedule 1.

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings and the matters observed at the site inspection, as listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

Development application

The Panel determined to approve the development application pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Panel determined to approve the application for the reasons outlined in the Council Assessment Report.

CONDITIONS

The Development Application was approved subject to the conditions in the Council Assessment Report, with the following amendments:

- The proposed landscaping screen is to be increased to a minimum width of 20m for its full length within the subject land and is to be planted with a double row of trees with under storey shrubs. A new condition is to be inserted that prior to the commencement of operations on the subject land the site plan is to be amended and submitted to Council for approval detailing the required 20m wide landscaping screen and the necessary reduction in the extent of the proposed quarry works.
- A new condition 15(1)(d) is to require an updated dilapidation report or reports to be prepared (and a copy in each instance provided to the relevant landowners) if any new buildings are constructed or major additions are made to existing dwellings within a 1km radius of the proposed quarry.
- Condition 46 is to be amended to require:
 - watering and irrigation measures as part of the maintenance schedule;
 - an independent report (including photographs) to be submitted to Council 5 years from commencement of the proposed quarry to confirm that the required landscaping screen is in place and in healthy condition; and
 - \circ $\;$ the landscaping to be maintained for the life of the quarry.

CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

In coming to its decision, the Panel considered written submissions made during public exhibition. The Panel was also addressed by a nearby property owner concerning perceived impacts of the proposed development upon the locality. The Panel notes that issues of concern included:

- Site suitability
- Inadequacies of specialist reports
- Environmental impacts on ground water
- Loss of ecology
- Loss of agricultural land
- Cumulative impacts
- Concerns over the growth of the renewable energy zone
- Land use conflicts
- Potential adverse impacts on surrounding communities
- Loss of amenity
- Noise concerns
- Impacts of blasting
- Traffic generation
- Air quality (dust)
- Visual impacts

The Panel considers that concerns raised by the community have been adequately addressed in the Assessment Report.
