MATTER DETERMINED

PPSWES-80 – Lithgow – DA069/21 at Excelsior Road Round Swamp for a Waste and Resource Management Facility (as described in Schedule 1)

PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The panel considered: the matters listed at item 6, the material listed at item 7 and the material presented at meetings and briefings and the matters observed at site inspections listed at item 8 in Schedule 1.

Development application

The panel determined to approve the development application pursuant to section 4.16 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The decision was unanimous.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The panel determined to approve the application for the reasons outlined in the council assessment report. The panel agreed with the recommendation in the council officers report however amended conditions 2, 7, 9 and 13 to strengthen the conditions or provide greater clarity.

CONDITIONS

The development application was approved subject to the conditions in the council assessment report with the following amendments.

- Condition 2 amended to read as follows:
 - This development consent operates in conjunction with development consent DA450/01. If the operation authorised by DA450/01 ceases to operate then the operation of the activities authorised by this consent must also cease.
- Condition 7 amended to read as follows:
 - This development consent is limited to the exportation of lime kiln dust from the Graymont Charbon Lime Kiln to the Excelsior Quarry for a period of five years from the date of the consent. The purpose of this limitation is to provide sufficient time for alternative uses of the lime kiln dust to be found. An extension of time for a further two-year period and/or a reduction of the total quantity of lime kiln dust referred to in condition 5 above may be approved by way of a written agreement between the operator, the NSW Environment Protection Authority and Lithgow City Council.
- Condition 9 amended to read as follows:
 All vehicles transporting lime kiln dust shall be securely covered or sealed to prevent dust escaping into the atmosphere.

- Condition 13 amended to read as follows:
 The following measures shall be implemented to manage dust from the transport and emplacement of lime kiln dust as outlined in the Environmental Impact Statement:
 - using securely covered or sealed trucks and/ or trailers
 - adding moisture to the material
 - not loading on windy days. A windy day is defined, for the purposes of this condition, as wind rated at 6 or greater on the Beaufort Scale https://www.anbg.gov.au/jrc/kayak/beaufort.html

CONSIDERATION OF COMMUNITY VIEWS

In coming to its decision, the panel notes that no written submissions were made during public exhibition and therefore no issues of concern were raised.
