
The decision was unanimous.

## **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

- 1. There are a number of issues which would be better and more efficiently examined cumulatively as part of an area wide rezoning process across the identified Kurmond Kurrajong Investigation Area, including particularly:
  - (a) the need for an upgrade to the intersections with The Bells Line of Road to increase safety and to respond to the RMS position advised in response to planning proposals already advancing through the Gateway process.
  - (b) the ordered and coordinated arrangement of pedestrian, vehicular and bicycle access within the Investigation Area to service new subdivisions.

- (c) a consistent approach to ecological protection of the environmental corridors across the Investigation areas.
- (d) the potential for increased and improved social facilities.
- (e) the development of a contributions plan to equitably fund a response to these matters.
- 2. Given advice from Council staff that the Kurmond Kurrajong Investigation is now progressing vigorously, the balance of the planning proposals awaiting gateway referral should be delayed until that Investigation concludes to allow a more consistent approach to these matters.
- 3. There are three factors which distinguish the consideration of this planning proposal referral application from earlier Gateway applications which were approved by the panel, and namely:
  - (a) Advice from the Council that (in contrast to previous delays) substantial steps have been taken in recent weeks to advance the Investigation, and particularly:
    - (i) a traffic study has been commissioned;
    - (ii) an ecological/biodiversity report is being prepared; and
    - (iii) identification of the appropriate agricultural classification is underway.
  - (b) Concerns that have recently raised by the RMS regarding the cumulative impact on the local road network within the Investigation Area.
  - (c) The two planning proposals recently approved for Gateway referral each had unique features, namely:
    - (i) The first was lodged on 30 January 2015 (two years before this application) before the Kurmond Kurrajong Investigation was announced, and
    - (ii) The other was on the northern side of The Bells Line of Road to which sewer connection is planned.
