## **REZONING REVIEW**

## RR-2023-13 – Wollondilly LGA – PP-2022-4330

10, 14 and 20 Brooks Point Road, Appin (As described in Schedule 1).

Reason for Review:

- The council has notified the proponent that the request to prepare a planning proposal has not been supported.
- □ The council has failed to indicate its support 115 days after the proponent submitted a request to prepare a planning proposal.
- □ The council has not submitted the planning proposal for a Gateway determination within 28 days of indicating its support for the proposal.

## PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered the material listed at item 4 and the matters raised and/or observed at briefings and site inspections listed at item 5 in Schedule 1.

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The Panel considered the material listed at item 4 and the matters raised and/or observed at site inspections and briefings listed at item 5 in Schedule 1.

Based on this review, the Panel recommends that the proposed instrument:

- □ **should** be submitted for a Gateway determination because the proposal has demonstrated strategic <u>and</u> site specific merit
- **should not** be submitted for a Gateway determination because the proposal has:
  - □ not demonstrated strategic merit
  - demonstrated strategic merit but not site specific merit

The decision was unanimous.

### **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

The Panel considered the documentation and was briefed by the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (Department) and heard extensively from Wollondilly Shire Council (Council) and the proponent, Beveridge Williams on 12 March 2024.

During Panel deliberations the planning proposal was discussed at length during which time the Panel identified that further information from the proponent and Sydney Water concerning the availability of sufficient wastewater infrastructure for the site and the wider Appin Precinct and Greater Macarthur Area was required to assess the site specific merit of the proposal proceeding at this time.

The Panel consequently deferred providing a decision on the rezoning review until it received further information from the proponent and Sydney Water.

The proponent provided supporting and clarifying information in the Beveridge Williams letter dated 18 March 2024 and attachments. Also on 18 March 2024 the Department provided a letter from Sydney Water dated 15 March 2024 which outlines updated infrastructure advice for the Appin Precinct and Greater Macarthur Area. The two letters formed the basis of the Panel's deliberations on 25 March 2024.

## **Strategic Merit**

The Panel agreed that the planning proposal had strategic merit given that:

- The planning proposal is consistent with applicable strategic planning documents, particularly as they relate to the general objectives for housing. These include the Greater Sydney Regional Plan 2056 (2018), Western City District Plan (2018), and Greater Macarthur 2040.
- Delivering housing supply is a priority issue for Sydney for all levels of Government.
- The site forms a logical extension of the Appin urban area.

#### **Site Specific Merit**

In considering the site specific merit of the proposal the Panel noted that the proposal would benefit from further consideration in terms of biodiversity, bushfire, traffic, existing and proposed adjoining uses, and social and economic impacts.

However, the Panel noted the written advice of 15 March 2024 from Sydney Water that there was no capacity for wastewater servicing for the proposal in the next 5 to 10 years. That position is stated in the letter to be a "change to advice" to previously available. No commitment was given that adequate servicing would be available even after a 10 year period. In the context of that letter, it was not demonstrated to the Panel's satisfaction that a subdivision anticipated by the proposal could be adequately serviced for wastewater disposal. The Panel was not therefore satisfied that the planning proposal adequately demonstrated site specific merit.

In response to the issue of available wastewater servicing, the proponent referred to the Wollondilly Shire Council's development consent granted to DA/2021/144/4 for the adjoining property and associated documents. However, that material did not persuade the Panel that the issue of wastewater servicing had been sufficiently resolved when examined in the context of the advice of 15 March 2024 from Sydney Water.

Accordingly, the Panel resolved that the proposal should not be submitted for Gateway determination.

The Panel noted that the planning proposal had been considered by Council officers, the Wollondilly Local Planning Panel and the elected Council, and had not been supported for similar reasons to that outlined above.
