#### **REZONING REVIEW**

#### RR-2025-11 - Port Stephens LGA - PP-2024-2768

196 Old Main Road and 263, 269, 271, 273, 293 and 321 Gan Gan Road, Anna Bay (As described in Schedule 1).

### Reason for Review:

$\boxtimes$	The council has notified the proponent that the request to prepare a planning proposal	has not	been

The council has failed to indicate its support 115 days after the proponent submitted a request to
prepare a planning proposal.

The council has not submitted the planning proposal for a Gateway determination within 28 days of
indicating its support for the proposal.

#### PANEL CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

The Panel considered the material listed at item 4 and the matters raised and/or observed at briefings and site inspections listed at item 5 in Schedule 1.

Based on this review, the Panel recommends that the proposed instrument:

- should not be submitted for a Gateway determination because the proposal has:
  - □ not demonstrated strategic merit nor site specific merit

The decision was unanimous, with all Panel members considering the proposal did not have strategic merit or site specific merit.

#### **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

The Panel considered the documentation, was briefed by the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure, and heard extensively from Port Stephens Council and the proponent, Mecone and their supporting technical experts.

## **Strategic Merit**

The Panel considers that the Planning Proposal and the proposed proponent amendments put forward at the briefing do not have Strategic Merit for the following reasons:

The recently endorsed Port Stephens Local Housing Strategy (LHS) has not identified the site for
residential development. The LHS carefully considered areas suitable for housing growth within
the Port Stephens LGA and previously considered the site for inclusion within these areas. The
outcome of the LHS consideration was that the site was not suitable for future housing growth
and that there are other less constrained areas within the LGA that are better suited for housing.

## Planning Panels Team

- The site has recently been identified on the Coastal Vulnerability Area mapping under State Environmental Planning Policy (Resilience and Hazards) 2021 (the SEPP). The proposal is not consistent with the objectives of the SEPP.
- The proposal is not consistent with relevant Ministerial Directions including Ministerial Direction 3.1 Conservation Zones, Ministerial Direction 4.1 Flooding and Ministerial Direction 4.2 Coastal Management.

The Panel notes that the LHS does not wholly address Port Stephens Council housing targets, but understands that Council is actively identifying areas and policy settings to address any shortfall.

## **Site-specific Merit**

The Panel considers the Planning Proposal does not have Site-specific Merit for the following reasons:

- The site is heavily constrained by biodiversity and flooding impacts.
- The proposed residential density in a flood prone area will exacerbate existing flooding issues within the Port Stephens LGA.
- The solution to raise the site out of the flood zone with significant amounts of fill is not supported.
- The proposal will remove and disturb a significant amount of high ecological value land and ecosystems.

The site is constrained and is not suitable for the intensity of use that the proposed planning framework would support.
