**Application for a site compatibility certificate – Concord RSL Club –
SCC_2018_CANAD_002_00**

I am writing in regard to the site compatibility certificate lodged with the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment on 23 October 2018. The application seeks a site compatibility certificate (SCC) at the Concord RSL Club at 1 Nullawarra Avenue, Concord.

The Department advises that the application has been returned to the proponent as incomplete. This is due to insufficient information being provided to demonstrate a complete application for assessment.

The Department understands that following the lodgement of the application, Concord RSL Club ceased to operate in early 2019. Subsequently, the Department sought clarification from the proponent regarding the current owners of the site with the authority to provide owners consent for the SCC application. This information was requested on multiple occasions; however, no information was provided.

Given that the application was lodged in accordance with clause 24 of the Seniors SEPP on the basis that the site is used for the purposes of a registered club, the Department requested that the proponent demonstrate that the club is still operating as a registered club. This information was also not provided.

Prior to the closure of the club, City of Canada Bay Council provided comments on the SCC application to assist in its assessment. The Department thanks the assistance of Council throughout the assessment process.

The proponent has been advised that any further SCC application will need to be lodged as a new application for assessment.
